

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#### 1. THE PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE:

Nandalal Borgohain City College was established in the Year 1992, in the name of Dibrugarh City College, as the outcome of the selfless, energetic, enthusiastic effort of the renowned educationist of Assam Late Nandalal Borgohain. It was later renamed in 2008 as Nandalal Borgohain City College in the Memory of the founder of the institution who was really an educated man and a real human being. From the very beginning, the college has been taking initiative to provide vocational, professional and job oriented courses through ITI, computer education and few short time job oriented course from time to time. The college has always been enthusiastic to open up new avenues for all the needy people who have the thirst for knowledge.

As a part of the effort to fulfill the motto of the College "Lead all ahead towards excellence" the college has been offering educational opportunities to all sections of the society including housewives and working adults. In fact the college always stands in front to lead education to the door steps of the learners/ people through KKHSOU, ITI, DODL under Dibrugarh University etc. It has attained recognition with sound student strength of NCC, NSS, sports, culture, music along with a good academic standard. With the achievements of academic, sports, cultural & other fields, the college has completed the 25 years journey and just passed the silver jubilee year in 2018.

The college got 'B' grade by NAAC in the year 2006. At that time, our college was the only non-provincialzed college of North-east India which was accredited by NAAC and awarded Grade 'B' with the institutional score 73.00. Now the college has been entered in the list of NIRF. The college has been organising different state and national level, discussions, seminars, workshops etc. and has been publishing a number of ISBN books by Nandalal Borgohain City College Publication for academic and intellectual upliftment of the institution.

The campus area of the college covers about 1.72 acres of land. Besides the well furnished classrooms, office buildings, well-equipped Library, an Auditorium, a Conference Hall, A Girls' Common Room, Boys' Common Room, Canteen & a two storied Girls' Hostel. The college proposes to construct another Hostel for the boys. Other support services of the college are - the Research Cell, Career Counselling Cell, Womens' Cell, Community Cell, ECO Club, SAHITTYACHORA, Cultural Department, Music Department NCC & NSS, Red Ribbon Club, Yoga Club Sports Department, etc. The college attempts to augment the quality of education as well as to create a hygienic atmosphere in the campus.

The Arts faculty of the college is consisting of nine departments namely- Assamese, English, Education, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, History, Philosophy and, Anthropology.

The Principalof the college and other five teachers have Ph. D.Degree, Fourteen teachers have M. Phil Degree & ten teachers have qualified NET/SET. The teaching faculty is energetic and quite competent and they prepare the annual teaching plan to complete the syllabus accordingly. At present the college has 60(Including ITI, IGNOU, KKHSOU, DODL, ASOS) well qualified and experienced teachers along with administrative, technical and supporting staff.

The Institution as never faltered in inspiring the students in the pursuit of knowledge, values, and social responsibility. The Institute has established its distinctive approach towards this comprehensive Vision by modelling it in the form of service to the society, by means of certificate courses or by allowing the students to organize events to develop their skills, multidisciplinary project development, Entrepreneurship development, Ethical and Human value development.

- a) Skill Development: The Institution arranges skill enhancement programs to develop their skills for example Personality enrichment, Employability skill development, Entrepreneurial development, Language skill development etc.
- b) Projects: Students at the UG and PG degree courses take up Internships in industries and pursue their projects which give them hands on training in their field of interest.
- c) Entrepreneurial Development: ED Cell crucially works on generating the excitement in the young brains to produce innovation and thus laying the stones for entrepreneurship. Budding entrepreneurs are motivated for start ups and thus are self-sufficient and independent financially and can either support their education or family.

Students have never been insensitive to the social crisis during the natural devastations. To mention and bring on record our students have contributed recently to the Kerala floods with basic required materials and financially which can be estimated to around Rs 5, 00, 000/-. During the Delta Floods our students reached out to the unreached area in the delta belt with relief materials and identified one farmer family in a particular village who were in a dreadful need of livelihood and sustenance. Our students collected funds from public and handed over 1, 00, 000/-. They were able to be restored to recreate their lives in a renewed mode.

#### 8. COLLEGE TRANSFER PROCEDURE:

Application to the Principal for transfer certificate will have to be accompanied by clearancecertificates from- (a) College Office (b) Library.

#### 9. ATTENDANCE:

A regular student must have more than 90% attendance as per rules laid down by Assam

HigherSecondary Education Council and Dibrugarh University.

A student who attends 80% of the classes shall however be allowed to appear in examination as a non-collegiate candidate on payment of prescribed fee. No candidate shall however be allowed to appear in the examination with below 70% of attendance in the theory classes.

A student must attend all practical classes and perform all practicals as required under the regulation of University/Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

#### 10. SCHOLARSHIP FACILITY:

For ST / SC / OBC / MOBC/TGL students Scholarships are available from the State Government.

#### 11. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1. Every student must obey and maintain the discipline of the college, which have been mentioned in different sections of college Prospectus. They must follow the discipline withinthe college jurisdiction and in the class room.
- 2. Students must take proper care of the college property. Destroying or damage of any furniture or equipments by the students, the college authority is bound to take disciplinary action against the committed student.
- 3. Ragging in any form in the college is strictly prohibited or creating any such unfair situation in the college premises is considered as crime and the Anti Ragging Committee will take immediate necessary action against any student found indulging in such activities.

#### 12. INFRUSTRUCTURAL FACILIES:

- i. **THE COLLEGE LIBRARY:** The College has a well equipped library with a spacious reading room. There are sufficient number of Text books, E-Journals, Journals and Newspapers along with reference books of variety of interest. The library remains open all working days from 9 A. M. to 4 P.M.
- ii. **LABORATORY:** The College has laboratory facilities for the department of Anthropology, Education and a Computer lab. There is also a beautiful museum along with the Laboratory of Anthropology. There is also psychological laboratory with well equipped instrument facilities in the Department of Education.
- iii. **AUDITORIUM**: The college has a big auditorium which was inaugurated by the exeducation minister of Assam, Mr. Ripun Borain to cater the needs of all the cultural activities of the college.
- iv. **GIRLS' COMMON ROOM:** Keeping in view the importance of extracurricular activities the college provides a Girls' Common Room where the girls can get involved in such activities. It is a spacious room with musical instruments and indoor game facilities.
- v. **BOYS' COMMON ROOM:** The College also provides a Boys' Common Room

for the exercise of the indoor and outdoor games. Along with the games facilities the common room has the traditional musical instruments like- *Dhol, Pepa, Taal, Gagana, Harmonium, Talba, Guiter etc.*

#### 14. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

- NCC: The NCC wing of the college was introduced on August 2006 under 10 Assam BN NCC Dibrugarh. Initially the total Number of NCC cadets (including boys andgirls') were only 30 (thirty).
